ROAR To Speak Against Christo’s Over the River Project At Fremont County Commissioner Public Meetings on February 1 & 2

ROAR, the local grassroots organization working to protect the Bighorn Sheep Canyon and the headwaters of the Arkansas River in Colorado and leading the opposition to Christo Javacheff’s Over The River project (OTR), will speak at the Fremont County Commissioners meetings on February 1, in Canon City and attend the February 2 meeting in Cotapaxi. The meetings were scheduled so the Fremont County Commissioners could hear public concerns before considering issuing a permit for Over the River Corporation's proposal to tarp the Arkansas River with aluminum coated material and disrupting life there for three years.

ROAR will present oral comments detailing the disruption to the local people, local businesses, wildlife, birds, fish, the Arkansas River and the Bighorn Sheep Canyon from **3 years of industrial scale construction and drilling operations** comparable to oil and gas exploration and the irreparable damage that will follow.

Dr. Ellen Bauder, a scientist and vice president of the ROAR Board of Directors, will present comments on behalf of ROAR during the morning session on February 1, at the Fremont County Administration Building in Canon City, CO. Many ROAR members and supporters will be present at the meetings to voice their concerns as well.
